**REPORT ON HIV AIDS DAY**

**INTRODUCTION :**

HIV (human immunodeficiency virus) is a virus that attacks the body's immune system. Without treatment, it can lead to AIDS (acquired immunodeficiency syndrome). There is currently no effective cure. Once people get HIV, they have it for life.

**WHAT IS WORLD AIDS DAY?**

World AIDS Day is observed on **1st December** every year to raise awareness about **HIV/AIDS**, support people living with HIV, and remember those who lost their lives. It aims to reduce stigma and promote education, prevention, and compassion.



**WHAT IS HIV ?**

HIV infects and destroys cells of your immune system, making it hard to fight off other diseases. When HIV has severely weakened your immune system, it can lead to acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS)

**WHAT IS AIDS ?**

AIDS is the final and most serious stage of an HIV infection. People with AIDS have very low counts of certain white blood cells and severely damaged immune systems. They may have additional



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illnesses that indicate that they have progressed to AIDS. Without treatment, HIV infections progress to AIDS in about 10 years.

### MODES OF TRANSMISSION :

- Unprotected Sexual Contact - HIV can be transmitted during vaginal, anal, or oral sex when there is no condom or the condom breaks. The virus is present in semen, vaginal fluids, and rectal fluids.
- Blood-to-Blood Contact  
This occurs when HIV-infected blood enters another person's bloodstream.  
How it happens:  
Sharing infected needles, syringes, or other sharp instruments  
Using contaminated tools for:  
Injecting drugs  
Tattooing  
Ear or nose piercing  
Unsafe medical procedures  
Accidental needle-stick injuries in healthcare settings
- Mother-to-Child Transmission (Vertical Transmission)  
HIV can pass from an infected mother to her baby.  
When it happens:  
During pregnancy (virus crosses the placenta)  
During childbirth (exposure to mother's blood and fluids)  
During breastfeeding (HIV is present in breast milk)
- Blood Transfusion with Infected Blood  
Transmission can occur if a person receives HIV-infected blood or blood products.  
Why this is rare today:  
Most countries strictly screen all donated blood for HIV  
Hospitals follow safe transfusion protocols  
Still a risk in places where screening is poor or unregulated.



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## **PREVENTION OF HIV AIDS :**

### **1. PRACTICE SAFE SEX**

Use condoms (male or female) correctly every time you have sex.

Avoid multiple sexual partners.

Choose mutual monogamy (both partners only with each other).

### **2. AVOID SHARING NEEDLES**

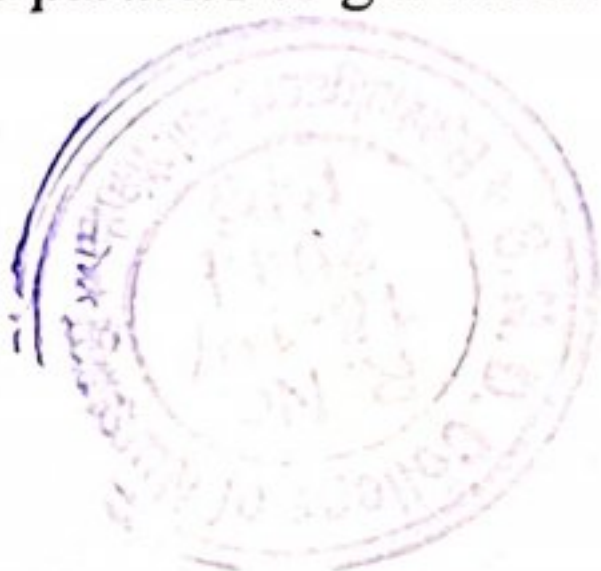
Never share needles, syringes, blades, or razors.

This is a major route of HIV transmission.

### **3. GET TESTED REGULARLY FOR HIV**

Early detection helps in treatment and prevents spreading the virus.

Encourage partners to get tested too.



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#### **4. ENSURE SAFE BLOOD TRANSFUSION**

Accept blood only from licensed blood banks where blood is properly screened for HIV.

#### **5. PREVENT MOTHER-TO-CHILD TRANSMISSION**

Pregnant women should undergo HIV testing.

If positive, ART medications can prevent transmission during pregnancy, delivery, and breastfeeding.

#### **6. USE ART (Antiretroviral Therapy)**

People living with HIV should take ART regularly.

When viral load becomes undetectable, the risk of transmission becomes extremely low (U=U: Undetectable = Untransmittable).

#### **7. AVOID CONTACT WITH INFECTED BLOOD**

Wear gloves when handling blood or body fluids.

Healthcare workers should follow universal precautions.

#### **8. EDUCATION & AWARENESS**

Spread awareness about safe sexual practices.

Avoid stigma and encourage people to get tested and treated.



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## ROLE OF NURSE:

### 1. HEALTH EDUCATION

Educate patients, family, and community about HIV transmission and prevention. Teach safe sex practices (use of condoms). Encourage avoidance of needle sharing and unsafe blood transfusions. Provide information on antiretroviral therapy (ART) and its importance.

### 2. COUNSELING

Provide emotional and psychological support. Offer pre-test and post-test counseling for HIV testing. Help patients cope with diagnosis, stigma, and lifestyle changes. Guide on disclosure of HIV status safely.

### 3. CARE AND TREATMENT

Administer ART medications as prescribed. Monitor side effects and adherence to treatment. Manage symptoms such as fever, diarrhea, weight loss, infections. Provide nutritional care and hydration support.

### 4. INFECTION CONTROL



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Follow strict universal precautions (gloves, hand hygiene). Proper disposal of sharps and biomedical waste. Educate patients on preventing transmission to others. Use PPE when handling blood or body fluids.

## 5. PREVENTION OF OPPORTUNISTIC INFECTIONS

Educate about hygiene, clean water, and safe food. Ensure vaccination (like Hepatitis B, pneumococcal, etc.). Monitor for early signs of infections like TB, pneumonia, fungal infections.

## 6. FAMILY AND COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Assist families in understanding disease management. Connect patients with support groups and NGOs. Help with social issues like stigma, job loss, discrimination.

## 7. RECORD KEEPING AND FOLLOW-UP

Maintain accurate patient records (CD4 count, viral load, ART schedule). Ensure regular follow-up visits. Track treatment adherence and complications.

The program commenced with a traditional Laxmi Poojan performed by all faculty members, seeking divine blessings for prosperity and well-being.





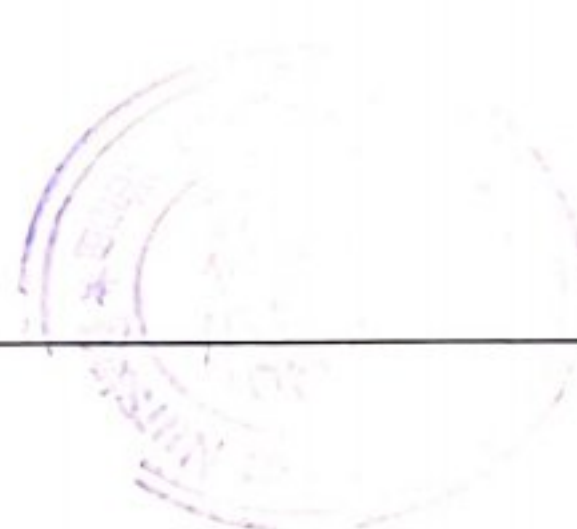
- **Cultural Activities:**

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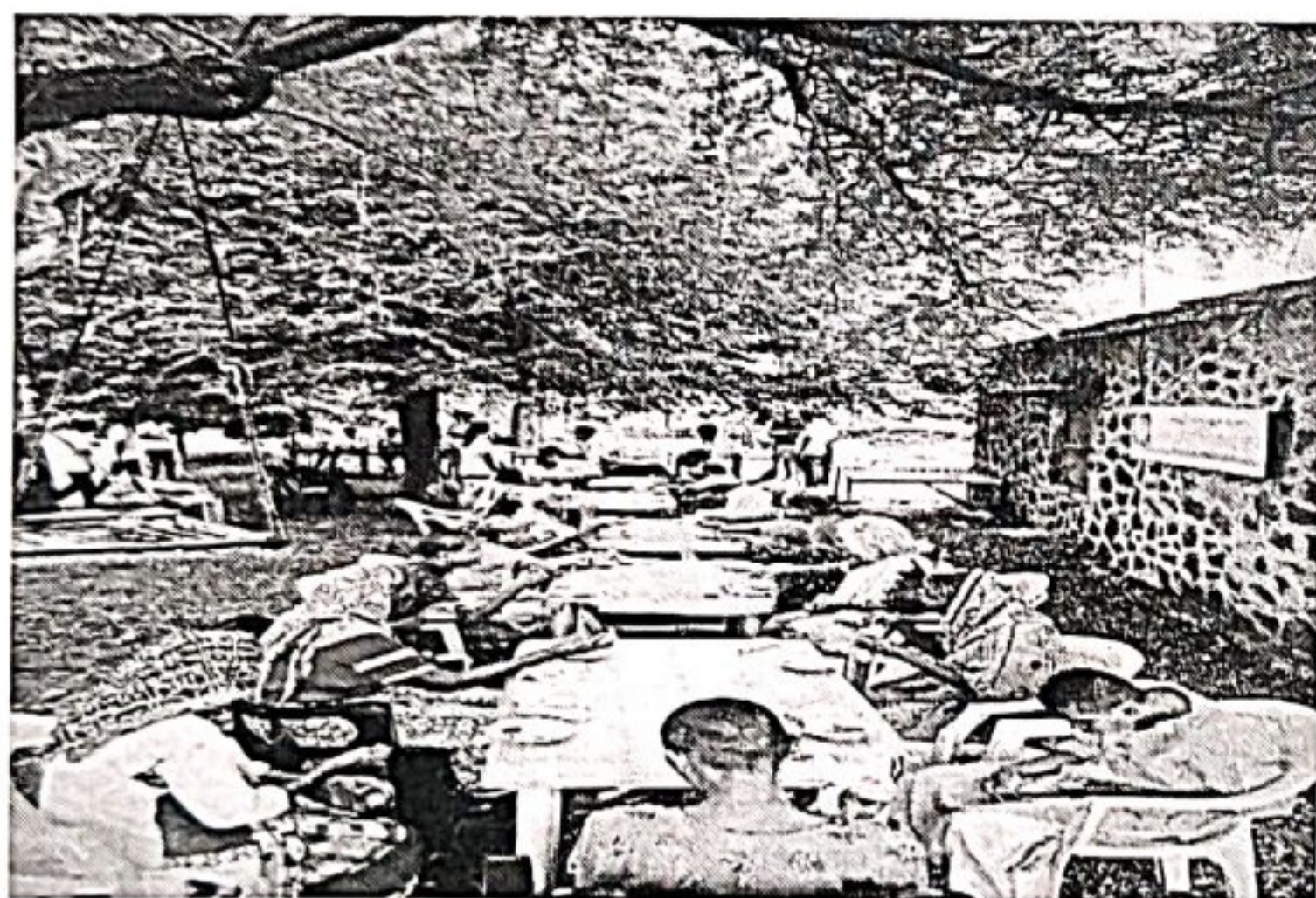


The purpose of the visit was to promote social responsibility, extend emotional support, and create awareness about health among the elderly.

4. Execute the school health program.
5. Evaluate the result and compare it with the aim of school health program.



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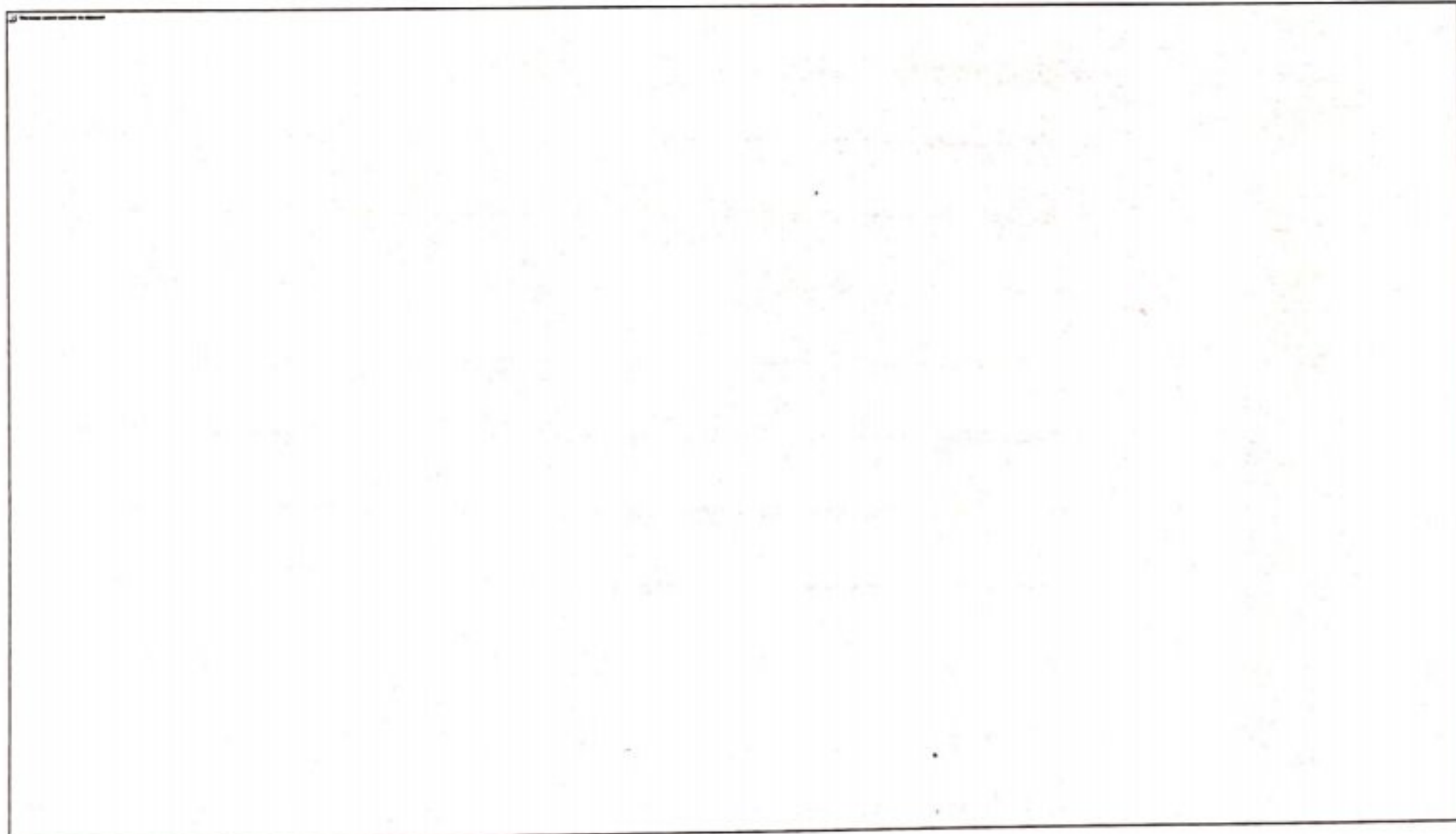
## **HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENT:**

The beginning of school health service in India dates back to, 1909 when for first time medical examination of school children was carried out in Baroda city. The Bhore committee (1946) reported that school health services were practically non-existent in India, and the existed, they were in underdeveloped state. In 1960 the Government of India constituted a school health committee to assess the standard of health and nutrition of school children and suggest ways and means to improve them.

## **PURPOSES OF SCHOOL HEALTH PROGRAM:**

The purposes of school health program are as follow:

1. The promotion of positive health The prevention of health problems
2. Early diagnosis, treatment and follow up of defects.
3. Awakening health consciousness in children
4. The provision of healthful environment



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## ASPECTS OF SCHOOL HEALTH PROGRAM:

The tasks of a school health service are manifold, and vary according to local priorities. Where resources are plentiful, special school health services may be developed. Some aspects of a school health service are as follows

1. Health appraisal of school children and school personnel
2. Remedial measures and follow up
3. Prevention of communicable diseases
4. Healthful school environment
5. Nutrition services
6. First aid and emergency
7. Dental health
8. Eye health
9. Health education
10. Proper maintenance and use of school health records

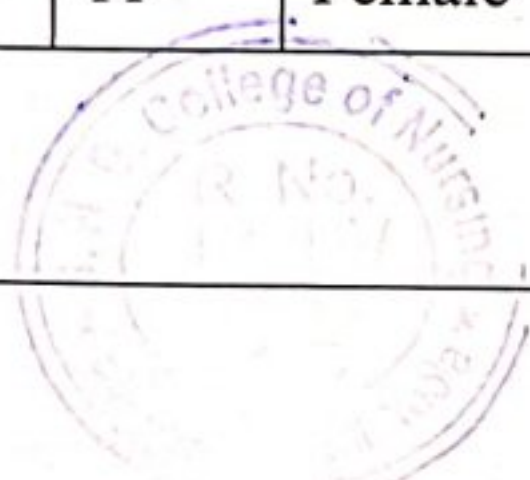

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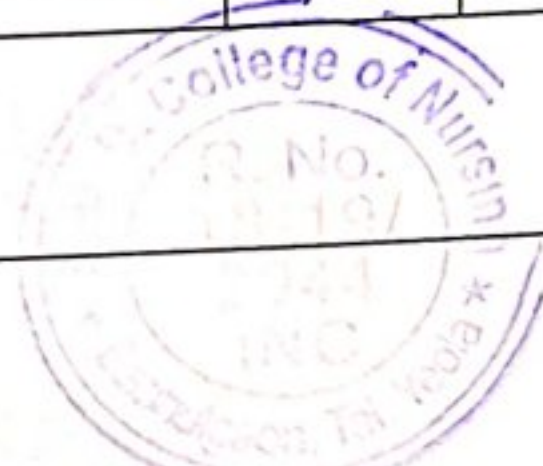

Lighting & Color: Good natural light; white or light-colored walls.

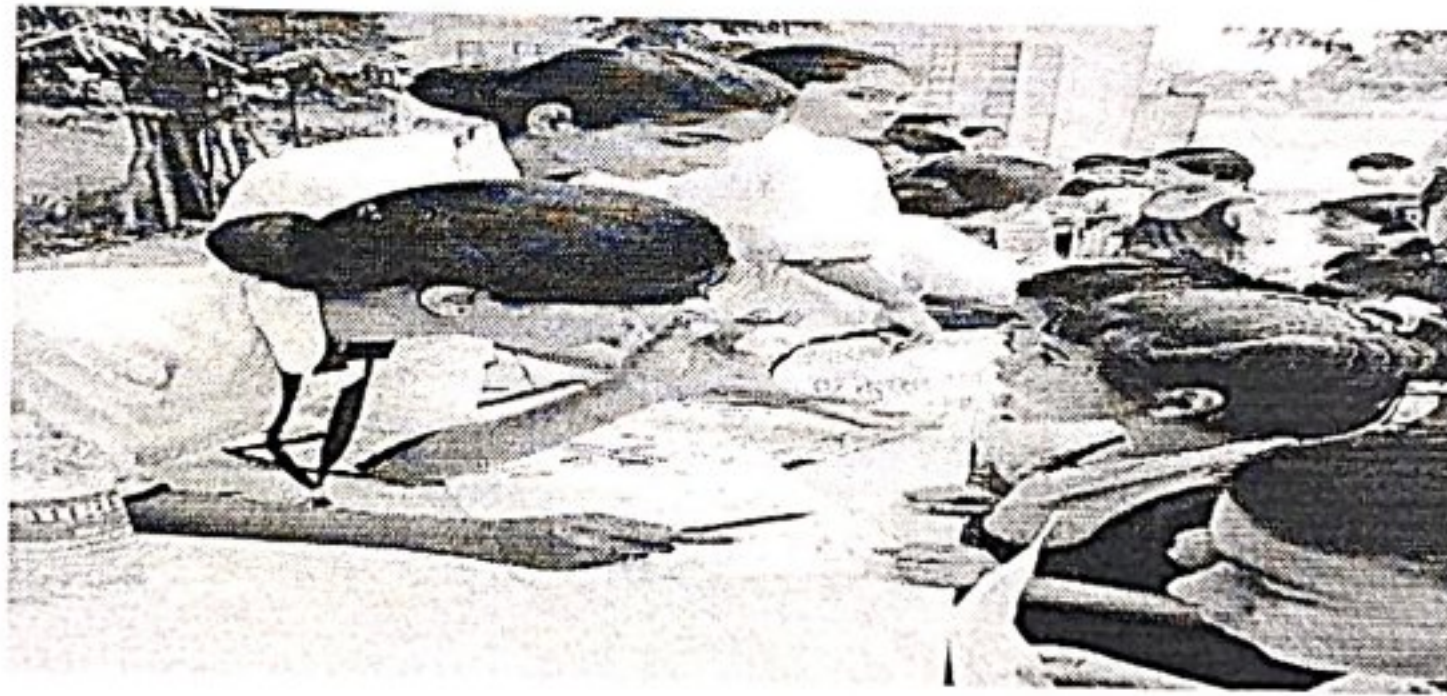
Water & Sanitation: Safe drinking water and separate toilets for boys and girls.

## 6. Specific Health Areas

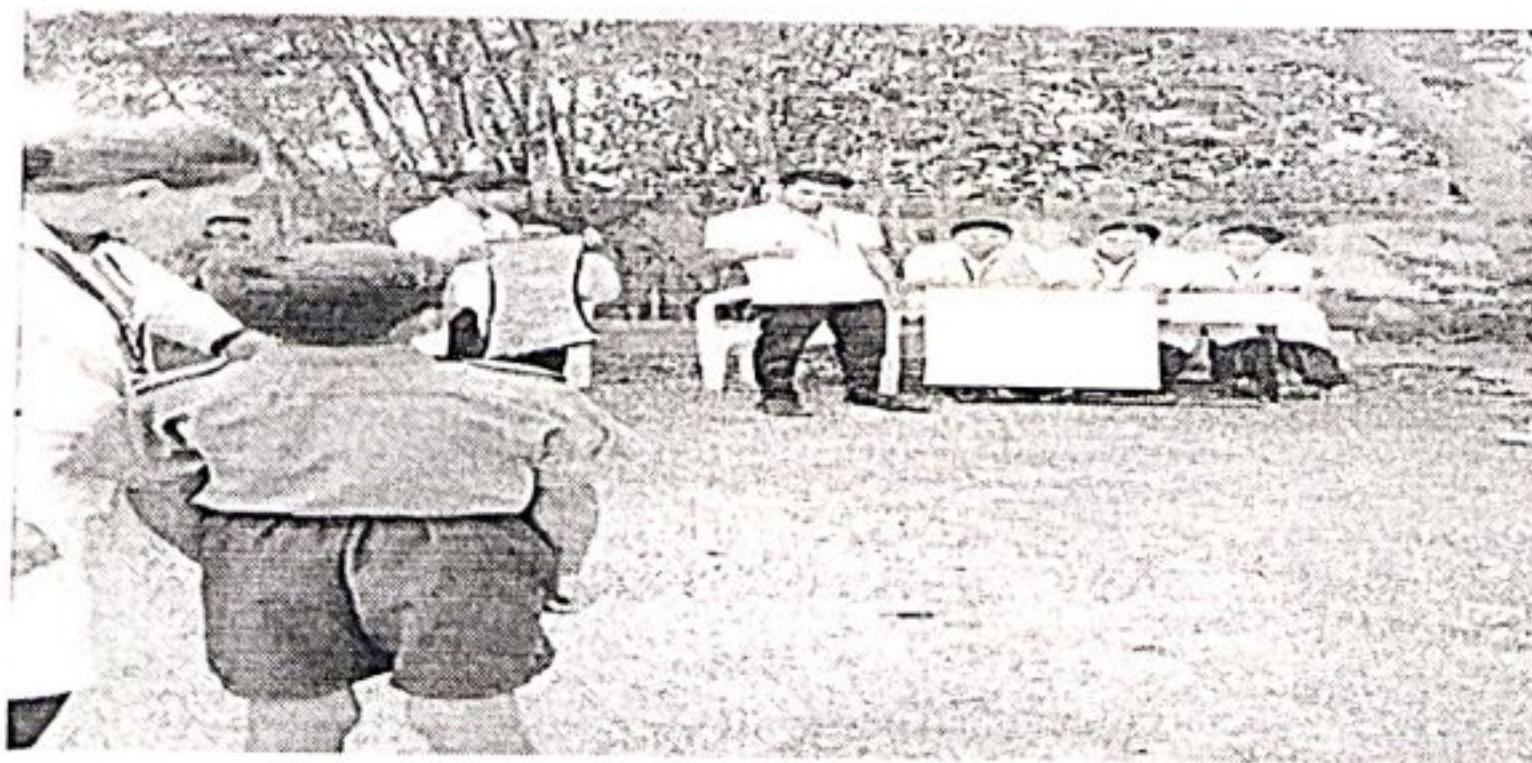
### a) Dental Health:

Weekly Iron & Folic Acid tablets are also given to children aged 6–10 years by teachers.

Prevention & Rehabilitation: Prevents complications and supports recovery.
